▶ We Get Convictions Expunged

What is an Expungement?

An expungement is a petition submitted to the court to request to have your case dismissed by the Judge. Under California state law, a judge has discretion in certain cases to withdraw your plea of guilty, enter a plea of not guilty, and then dismiss your case. If the Judge believes it's in the interest of justice, they may grant your petition to expunge. If the petition is granted, then the conviction is removed from your criminal background!

How Can an Expungement Help You?

Unless a felony conviction is reduced or expunged, most hospitals will not hire someone with a criminal record.

For aspiring nurses, in order for your enrollment to be accepted you must have a clean record. In fact, most private and public jobs today require a clean criminal record.

Unfortunately, many employers today will only hire candidates with no criminal record even if the candidate is less qualified.

An expungement by the Superior Court may be your answer.
